We invite all members to submit ideas for the 2022 Project, which will be evaluated by the Trustees with the goal of selecting the project or projects at our February meeting and implement them in the first half of 2023. The committees reported on their plans for 2023. The Sustainability committee continues to work with the Borough on issues such as flood management and the upcoming beach renourishment. The Membership committee is preparing to kick-off the 2023 membership renewal campaign. 

## **Flood Mitigation Update**



SHPOA Trustees are participating in a newly formed Flood Mitigation committee established after the plans for the 93rd St. pump station were cancelled last fall. The committee, led by Public Works Director Manny Parada, is initially focused on mitigating tidal flooding in the 91st - 95th street and Sunset/3rd Ave flood district. Designs are being






These will mitigate bay water in those areas



height, wind direction / speed, and rainfall levels. SHPOA will continue to request assistance from our membership in flood damage documentation.






