Update on the 96th Street Stone Harbor Bridge at the Tower - Robert Church, P.E., Cape May County Engineer

As a reminder, the original schedule was to have the following Construction Phases:

This is an interim update on the construction of the 96th Street Stone Harbor



1. First Closure - Winter 2025-2026

A short closure (estimated ~30 days) in February 2026 for initial work. Cause: heavy machinery needed—traffic detoured to Avalon Blvd via Ocean Drive or via Grassy Sound/Ocean Drive route



2. Temporary Bridge Phase - Fall 2026

Installation of temporary fixed-span bridge replacing drawbridge functionality. Will not open for boat traffic, restricting marine navigation under only ~9 ft vertical clearance (no draw). Channel reduced—boats over that height must detour via alternate inlets During summer traffic, temporary bridge accommodates vehicles—BUT marine traffic is limited. Initial detour for motorists not impacted; vessels must plan alternate routes.

3. Final Closure - Late 2027 to Feb 2028

Closure of bridge and temporary span for final installation. Estimated duration ~100 days.

Vehicle access to Stone Harbor will require full detour via Avalon and Ocean Drive

The original aim was to reopen by May 2028 before peak beach season. Although plans and specifications for the project are essentially complete and environmental permits have been addressed, the process this past winter/spring was unexpectedly delayed by additional discussions with the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACOE) regarding widening the existing bascule opening. This created a cascading delay with the issuance of the bridge permit by the United States Coast Guard (USCG) since they needed mutual consent by the USACOE before they would move forward with issuing the permit.

Since the inter-agency coordination has taken longer than anticipated, we have missed the 2025 construction start window. With the new 2026 tentative construction start date, the remaining construction work will move back linearly. Once we have the permits in hand, we will have a much higher degree of confidence in the tentative construction start and will issue a public notice confirming the revised schedule.





Historical Stone Harbor - Courtesy of Stone Harbor Museum

Each month we bring you a memory from the past, courtesy of the Stone Harbor Museum.





BACK IN TIME - Here is a photo of the Van Thuyne General Store located between First and Second Avenue at 180 85th Street and fronting on the broad Pennsylvania Railroad Station Plaza in Stone Harbor. Built in the year 1910 by Miss Marie L. Van Thuyne, this structure originally became the leading general store in town for a few years. We understand that this photo was snapped on the 4th of July 1912. Given the abundance of 48-star American Flags and other red, white, and blue bunting and decorations, it appears that this was indeed a celebratory time dedicated to recognizing and commemorating Independence Day in the United States. This particular occasion marked the 136th year of American Independence. Several years later and by 1917, this large building was converted to spacious apartments conveniently located within a three minute walk from the beach. The South Jersey Realty Company brochures for the summer of 1917 indicated that there were two upper apartments available each with 5 rooms including 2 bedrooms, bath, and porches. It was reported that rent for the season for the furnished upper apartments was \$150 each. In addition, those illustrated S.J.R.C. real estate brochures went on to specify there were two lower or first floor 8 room apartments available for rent offering 5 bedrooms, bath and screened porch. Rent, fully furnished, for the season for the ocean side apartment was \$250 and the other side was \$200.

If you look carefully, you just might be able to see Miss Van Thuyne in her white dress with others standing on the front porch of her business establishment. There is a well marked side entrance and a large sign on the front side of this building which states the following: "STOP / SPEND A PLEASANT HOUR / STONE HARBOR AMUSEMENT PARLOR / POOL & REFRESHMENTS / TABLES FOR LADIES".

One final note, although barely noticeable but yet discernible on the roof, is the following eye-catching advertisement - 12 large white painted letters forming just two words for all to see at a distance when entering the town - "GENERAL STORE"! The two dormers jutting out on the third floor attic sloping roof actually separate the painted letters to appear as: "GENE / RAL / STORE". One has to wonder if such a conspicuous roof-top advertising sign as I have just presented and described here would be allowed today in Stone Harbor given the many evolving changes in town zoning regulations and community business and commercial standards!
